Program Structure

Curated content for emerging leaders.

The **Engaged Leadership Program** consists of 25-35 hours of course material, community engagement, and roundtables with high-profile business leaders over a 6-month period. All program activities will be scheduled beginning in January and participants are required to attend all courses and roundtables and to participate in events and community outreach activities. This highly interactive program is delivered through a hybrid model of in-person and online.

- An undergraduate degree in any discipline - industry experience may be considered in place of an academic degree.
- Have a minimum of five years of professional work experience, including two years of management or leadership role*.
- Reside in the Greater Vancouver region for the duration of the program.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills.

** Most participants have between 5 and 15 years of professional work experience.*

Learning requirements: In order to earn a Certificate of Completion, participants must partake in all courses and complete all coursework by stated deadlines, participate in at least one (1) community outreach initiative, and attend all private roundtables by June 2023.
