LEADERSHIP | Embracing adversity and growth


Welcome to the latest installment of Q&A, our regular series of one-toones with some of Greater Vancouver's leading business figures. Our subject this week is Sophia Cote, Head of Public Affairs -Canada, REEF Technology

What was your first job?

My very first job was teaching dance to children between the ages of 5-10 when I was around 15. I was very seriously into dance, particularly ballet when I was a teenager, and so being able to spread the joy and discipline of the art to young kids was an absolute honour and privilege.

What inspires you?

Challenges can be very hard in life. Some see challenges as an obstacle, but for me, being challenged and going out of my way to push to the next level is inspiring. Sometimes life needs changes because things have become stale or too predictable. Challenges break that mould, and the ideas and excitement that come



What is your most prized possession and why?

I know this sounds cliché, but I really don't care too much about material things. My husband always makes fun of me that I never want a new phone, watch etc. But I have realized that for me, the most important prize is travelling the world and experiencing different cultures. Where do you see untapped potential in Greater Vancouver?

I really do believe that if we continue fostering talent (and make sure that salaries keep up with demand) and create business-friendly policies for home-grown tech companies to grow and expand, the region can become one of North America's top tech hubs.

What is the most important lesson, business or otherwise, life has taught you?

When faced with a crisis or adversity, it can be difficult in the moment to imagine the experience will eventually lead to some type of growth. The most important lesson that life has taught me is to be resilient and to have the strength to bounce back from adversity and grow from the challenge. It's helped me feel like I have a little more mastery in my life and taught me to have more compassion and sensitivity for those around me.

What do you think makes a great leader?

Ultimately, a great leader creates and nurtures others. I believe that the best leaders are passionate about developing the emerging leaders around them, they constantly work to improve their emotional intelligence and know that a strong team culture is the foundation for accomplishing the mission.

What keeps you awake at night?

The current geopolitical crisis with Russia and Ukraine. My mother's side of the family all lives in Germany, and my time living in Berlin made me very aware of how fragile peace in Europe really is, but also how much we take global peace for granted. The current crisis not only challenges western democracy and the rule of law, and destabilizes the current world order, but it also comes at a time when the whole world is vying to find out ways and means of reviving the economy and normalizing the growth trajectory post-COVID-19.

Where is your favourite place in Vancouver?

My happy place is a small, local Italian bakery, restaurant and wine bar on Commercial Drive called Livia. Every weekend, I go there for breakfast, and their incredible coffee and breakfast sandwiches just put me in the right mindset to enjoy some time off from a busy work week. sc

Training the ESG leaders of the future

A n inaugural class of Metro Vancouver business leaders spanning many sectors are accessing a new training program to put ESG practices into action.

The ESG Fundamentals Microcredential equips individuals to understand their environmental, social, and governance (ESG) impact and develop solutions to improve their measurement and outcomes. The Greater Vancouver Board of Trade launched the ESG Fundamentals Microcredential in partnership with the BCIT School of Business + Media, and today marks the launch of the inaugural offering.

"B.C. businesses are perfectly positioned to capitalize on the global appetite for products and services that meet the highest standards of ethics and sustainability, but they need knowledge leaders who can help them build on that success," noted Bridgitte Anderson, President and CEO of the Greater Vancouver Board of Trade. "Despite the B.C. advantage of a strong foundation in clean energy infrastructure, workforce diversity and governance transparency, organizations in our province want to do more."

Expert instructors from BCIT and top-tier executives from the private sector have collaborated to provide a unique training program that blends theory and practical application. Geoff Pegg is leading the Governance Impacts session, drawing on his own experience as the Director of Sustainability and Environment at TELUS. "I think about how companies such as TELUS can work with citizens, communities, customers, Indigenous Peoples and other stakeholders to make a positive social and environmental impact when executing on its purpose, while managing



associated risks with relevant

oversight," Pegg explained. Participants in the program will work with instructors and industry leaders to craft an ESG Roadmap tailored to their organization. The individually tailored plans will identify actions and create momentum to put that plan into action.

B.C. businesses have a long history of corporate social

responsibility and have consistently demonstrated an appetite to go further. The ESG Fundamentals Microcredential is designed to equip leaders with the knowledge to do just that. SB
